IN SUMMARY, ON 1/4/10 AT 0540 HOURS, I WAS DISPATCHED TO 2066 217TH ST IN REFERENCE TO A STOLEN FIREARM REPORT. UPON ARRIVAL, [REDACTED] ADVISED HE BELIEVES ONE OF TWO PEOPLE STOLE HIS BLACK SMITH AND WESSON .357 REVOLVER FROM UNDER HIS LIVING ROOM COUCH. HE ADVISED HE LAST SAW THE GUN ON 1/3/11 AT 1900 HOURS WHEN HE TOOK IT OUT OF HIS GUN SAFE. [REDACTED] ADVISED HE LOCKS THE GUN IN THE SAFE WHEN HIS SON IS OVER, BUT HE TAKES IT BACK OUT WHEN HE LEAVES. HE ADVISED HE OPENED THE CASE TO TAKE OUT THE SPEED LOADER AND PLACED THE CASE UNDER THE COUCH.

During the afternoon hours of 9/13/12 I conducted additional follow up reference a reported theft. I met with victim [REDACTED] stated he learned a possible suspect had attempted to sell his tattoo equipment. [REDACTED] further stated he spoke to employees at Surefire Tattoos in Lynwood, Illinois. The employees told [REDACTED] a subject had come into the store several days ago and attempted to sell them tattoo equipment. The equipment matched the description of the items stolen (from [REDACTED]). The store employees provided a description of the offender (to [REDACTED]). The description matched John E. Holcomb [REDACTED] of 1854 221st St.. [REDACTED] knew Holcomb and believed Holcomb knew about [REDACTED] property and when he [REDACTED] was home.

At about 1600 hours I completed a photo array consisting of six photos. Photo #6 was suspect Holcomb. A short time later I met with the employees in question at Surefire. They were identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. They both provided, in summary, the following. A subject matching Holcomb's description came into their shop around 1800 hours on 9/7/12. The subject attempted to sell them the tattoo equipment in question. The items were not valuable and they thought it was suspicious so they declined to make the purchase. [REDACTED] agreed to view they array and signed a line-up waiver form [REDACTED] each viewed the array independently. They positively identified Holcomb (photo #6) as the subject who tried to sell the equipment in question. The array and related forms were made part o the case file.

On 9/13/12, at the detective's request, suspect John Holcomb arrived at the police station. I met with Holcomb at 1750 hours. Holcomb was advised of his rights according to Miranda. Holcomb advised he understood his rights and agreed to answer questions regarding the investigation. Holcomb signed a Miranda waiver.

Holcomb advised, in summary, the following. Holcomb stated he went to Surefire Tattoo at the date and time in question and tried to sell the tattoo equipment. Holcomb stated he got the items from Jerron Appleton. Holcomb advised, prior to going to the Surefire, Appleton arrived at his residence. Appleton had the tattoo equipment and asked Holcomb if he know a way to sell it. Holcomb suggested they go to Surefire. Holcomb and Appleton went to Surefire but Holcomb was unable to sell the items. Holcomb gave the tattoo equipment back to Appleton. Holcomb stated he did not knew where Appleton got the tattoo equipment but agreed "it looked bad". Holcomb denied ever entering Glaze's house and did not know anything about a stolen firearm.

Holcomb was processed and charged with one count of Possession of Stolen Property (theft) under 720 ILCS 5/16-1(a)(4). Holcomb was given a court date of 10/31/12. Holcomb was later released on a \$1500.00 bond.

Appleton advised, in summary, the following. Holcomb contacted him during the evening hours of 9/13/12 and requested he (Appleton) lie for him. Holcomb told Appleton to say he (Appleton) had the tattoo guns. Appleton stated he knew nothing about any tattoo guns and denied ever going to Surefire (with Holcomb). Appleton stated the subjects who identified him in the line ups must have been mistaken.

Appleton was processed and charged with one count of Possession of Stolen Property (Theft) under 720 ILCS 5/16-1(a)(4). Appleton was given a court date of 10/31/12 at the Sixth District Courthouse. Appleton was later released on a \$1500.00 bond.

Investigative Summary #1
Det. Grossman #117 6/28/13

During the evening hours of 6/28/13 I was assigned to investigate reported Aggravated Discharge of a Firearm in the area of 1854 221st St.. I learned suspect Steven Krauss was currently in police custody. I spoke to responding officers Ofc. Agauyo and Sgt. Evans. They provided, in summary, the same account of events as indicated in the initial report. Based on that information I performed a Gun Shot Residue (GSR) test on suspect Krauss. The test was logged in evidence, exhibit #1 and will be sent to the Illinois State Police Crime Lab for analysis. I further learned there is a security system that includes audio and video at the victim's residence. The video did not capture the actual shooting as reported (because of the placement of the cameras and location of the incident). The video shows Krauss flee the area and a loud noise can be heard that appears to be a gunshot. I obtained a DVD copy of the audio/ video of the incident. It was logged and placed in evidence, exhibit #2.

At 1952 hours I met with Krauss. Kraus was advised of his rights according to Miranda. Krauss advised he understood his rights and agreed to answer questions regarding the investigation. Krauss signed a Miranda waiver form.

Kraus advised, in summary, the following. Krauss has known victim [REDACTED] for many years. There have been ongoing problems (between Krauss and [REDACTED] in the past. At the date and time in question Kraus and [REDACTED] got into a verbal altercation. Krauss told [REDACTED] to leave the area. Krauss and [REDACTED] continued to argue. Krauss punched [REDACTED] in the eye with his fists. Krauss then left the area. Krauss denied having or firing a gun at any time.

Krauss remained in police custody pending further investigation.

During the morning hours of 6/29/13 I conducted additional follow up reference the incident at 1854 221st St. I learned, in summary, the following. Two other residents, identified as [REDACTED] may have been present for the incident. Both [REDACTED] reside at [REDACTED]. Suspect Krauss moved into 1844 221st St. about two weeks prior to the incident.

I contacted the Cook County Felony Review Unit. At about 1330 hours A.S.A. Jean Kolasa arrived at the police station. A.S.A. Kolasa and I met with victim [REDACTED] provided, in summary, and not verbatim, the same account of events as provided in earlier interviews. [REDACTED] statement was reduced to writing by A.S.A. Kolasa. [REDACTED] written statement was made part of the case file. A.S.A. Kolasa and I reviewed the video surveillance. We were assisted by [REDACTED] father, [REDACTED] provided assistance in paying back the video.

At about 1530 hours A.S.A. Kolasa and I met with suspect Steven Krauss. Krauss was advised of his rights according to Miranda (by A.S.A. Kolasa). Krauss advised he understood his rights and agreed to answer questions regarding the investigation. Krauss provided, in summary, and not verbatim, the same account of

events as provided to this Detective on 6/28/13.

A.S.A. Kolasa and I then met with [REDACTED] stated he was at 1844 221st St. during both the day and evening hours. [REDACTED] stated Krauss moved in to the residence about two weeks ago. During the afternoon hours of 6/28/13 [REDACTED] became despondent over the recent loss of his [REDACTED] wife. [REDACTED] told Krauss about a gun (that [REDACTED] owned). [REDACTED] told Krauss where the gun was and that he wanted Krauss to take it. [REDACTED] stated he was depressed and did not want access to the gun. [REDACTED] did not see Krauss with the gun during the afternoon but was suspicious. [REDACTED] was concerned because Krauss was walking around repeatedly touching his waistband as if he had a gun. [REDACTED] stated that during the evening hours (of 6/28/13) [REDACTED] and Krauss started to argue about watching the children. [REDACTED] did not see the actual altercation but heard a "popping" noise. [REDACTED] went out side to see what happened. [REDACTED] saw Krauss enter the garage (at 1844 221st St.). [REDACTED] followed Krauss into the garage to help close the garage door. [REDACTED] stated he did not see Krauss with a gun.

A.S.A. Kolasa and I then met with [REDACTED] stated he was very depressed on 6/28/13 regarding the loss of his wife. [REDACTED] stated he started drinking at about 1530 hours (on 6/28/13). [REDACTED] stated he "blacked out" and later woke up in a pool of his own vomit. [REDACTED] did not recall any of the events of 6/28/13. [REDACTED] stated he learned about the incident after the fact. [REDACTED] stated he does own a .40 caliber handgun but did not recall telling Krauss about it. [REDACTED] stated his gun is still in his [REDACTED] room.

A.S.A. Kolasa and I reviewed the facts of the case to date. At 1711 hours A.S.A. Kolasa approved felony charges. Krauss was processed and charged with one count of Aggravated Discharge of a Firearm under 720 ILCS 5/24-1.2(a)(1) and one count of Aggravated Battery under 720 ILCS 5/12-3.05(f)(1). During further investigation I learned Krauss was currently on parole for Home Invasion reference I.D.O.C. #N98883. I contacted I.D.O.C. and advised them of the case status. A Parole Violation warrant was issued. Krauss was later transported to the Sixth District Courthouse for a bond hearing.

IN SUMMARY: ON 06-21-09 AT 2314 HOURS, OFFICERS HUFNAGL #134, THIBO #137, LANGAN #132 AND I WERE DISPATCHED TO THE AREA OF 221ST STREET AND CLYDE AVENUE IN REFERENCE TO A SHOTS FIRED CALL. AN UNKNOWN FEMALE CALLER ADVISED TWO SUBJECTS WERE SHOOTING. THE SUBJECTS WERE DESCRIBED AS TWO BLACK MALES.

I ARRIVED IN THE AREA AND WAS STOPPED BY AN UNKNOWN MOTORIST WHO ADVISED THE SUBJECTS INVOLVED WERE LAST SEEN RUNNING SOUTH ON CLYDE FROM 221ST STREET. OFFICERS CANVASSED THE AREA IN AN ATTEMPT TO LOCATE THE SUBJECTS. WHILE I WAS TRAVELING NORTH ON MERRILL AVENUE, THE SAME UNKNOWN MOTORIST STOPPED ME AGAIN AND ADVISED THE SUBJECTS WERE AT A HOUSE LOCATED ON THE CORNER OF 221ST STREET AND CLYDE. THE VICTIM, LATER IDENTIFIED AS [REDACTED] WAS IN THE VEHICLE WITH THE UNKNOWN SUBJECT AND ADVISED THE SUSPECTS WERE BLACK MALES, ONE WEARING A WHITE SHIRT WITH BLACK SHORTS, AND THE OTHER WAS DRESSED IN ALL BLACK CLOTHING.

I ARRIVED AT THE RESIDENCE ON CLYDE AVENUE AND ENCOUNTERED THREE BLACK MALES, TWO OF WHICH MATCHED THE WITNESS' DESCRIPTION. I BEGAN TO QUESTION THE SUBJECTS WHEN [REDACTED] EXITED THE VEHICLE AND ADVISED THESE WERE THE SUBJECTS INVOLVED. [REDACTED] STATED, "THEM, THESE ARE THE GUYS." I ASKED [REDACTED] AGAIN IF THESE WERE THE SUBJECTS INVOLVED AND HE STATED "YES." AT THAT POINT I DREW MY WEAPON AND ORDERED THE TWO SUBJECTS TO THE GROUND. THE SUBJECT IN THE WHITE AND

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BLACK WAS HESITANT, BUT EVENTUALLY COMPLIED. THE SUBJECT IN ALL DARK CLOTHING REFUSED TO GET ON THE GROUND, STATING, "MAN I DIDN'T DO ANYTHING WRONG, I AIN'T GETTING ON THE GROUND." FOR THE SAFETY OF THE WITNESS AND THE OFFICERS ON SCENE, I PLACED THE SUBJECT ON THE GROUND. AT THAT POINT [REDACTED] THEN STATED THE TWO MEN ON THE GROUND WERE NOT THE SUSPECTS. HE ADVISED THE SUSPECTS EITHER RAN INTO THE HOUSE THE MEN WERE STANDING IN FRONT OF, OR THROUGH THE YARD. THE SUBJECTS WERE RELEASED AND I QUESTIONED JOHN FURTHER.

[REDACTED] ADVISED HE WAS STANDING NEAR HIS RESIDENCE IN THE 1800 BLOCK OF 221ST WHEN THE SUSPECTS WERE SEEN TRAVELING ON FOOT EAST ON 221ST. HE ADVISED ONE OF THE SUSPECTS THREW A PLASTIC BOTTLE DOWN ON THE STREET. [REDACTED] ADVISED THE SUSPECTS TO USE A GARBAGE CAN, AND ONE OF THE SUSPECTS BEGAN TO ARGUE WITH HIM. [REDACTED] STATED HE BEGAN TO FOLLOW THE SUSPECTS EAST ON 221ST. HE ADVISED WHEN THE SUSPECTS APPROACHED THE INTERSECTION OF 221ST AND CLYDE AVENUE, THEY SPLIT UP. ONE SUSPECT BEGAN WALKING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF 221ST, WHILE THE OTHER CONTINUED WALKING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE STREET. WHEN THE SUSPECT ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF 221ST STREET REACHED THE INTERSECTION, [REDACTED] ADVISED THE SUSPECT TURNED AROUND AND FIRED TWO SHOTS FROM WHAT JOHN BELIEVED WAS A SEMIAUTOMATIC PISTOL. [REDACTED] ADVISED HE RAN BACK TOWARD HIS RESIDENCE, AND THE SUSPECTS RAN SOUTH ON CLYDE AVENUE. [REDACTED] WAS NOT INJURED.

DETECTIVE DAVITT WAS CALLED OUT TO PROCESS THE SCENE. THE BOTTLE THAT WAS THROWN ON THE STREET WAS COLLECTED AS EVIDENCE. DET. DAVITT, OFC. LANGAN AND I SEARCHED THE AREA OF 221ST STREET AND CLYDE FOR EMPTY SHELL CASINGS, WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS. THE AREA TREES AND HOUSES WERE CHECKED FOR POSSIBLE BULLET FRAGMENTS, WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS.

WHILE DET. DAVITT AND I WERE SEARCHING FOR SHELL CASINGS, [REDACTED] APPROACHED US AND ADVISED HE WAS STANDING NEXT TO [REDACTED] WHEN THE INCIDENT OCCURRED. HE GAVE THE SAME STATEMENT [REDACTED] GAVE, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE POSSIBLE WEAPON. [REDACTED] STATED HE BELIEVED THE WEAPON USED WAS A REVOLVER. WHEN ASKED WHY HE BELIEVED SO, HE STATED HE THOUGHT IT WAS A REVOLVER BECAUSE HE COULD NOT FIND ANY SHELL CASINGS. WHEN [REDACTED] GAVE HIS ACCOUNT OF THE INCIDENT, HE WAS FOLLOWING THE SUSPECTS BY HIMSELF.

[REDACTED] ADVISED IF HE SAW THE SUSPECTS, HE COULD POSITIVELY IDENTIFY THEM. THERE WAS NO FURTHER EVIDENCE TO BE COLLECTED, AND NO FURTHER SUSPECT INFORMATION AVAILABLE AT THIS TIME.
